How to use Chopsticks (With pencils)

Traditionally, chopsticks are used instead of a knife and fork in Japan, and are used to mix food when cooking.

KS1 & KS2

Let's practise with 2 pencils!

- Mold out your writing hand as though you are going to shake someone's hand.
- Put a pencil under your thumb, resting on your palm.
- Hold a second pencil between your thumb and the finger next to it.
- Bend your little finger and the one next to it, under the lower pencil to support it.
- 6 Put your middle finger under the other pencil (the one on top).
- Move the top pencil up and down!
- You can now practise gripping small, light things!
