Competency Requirements for registrants undertaking independent/freelance practice



Overview

- An increasing number of registrants are working in an independent/freelance capacity. A number of additional competencies have been identified as being required to provide protection for the public, for those working in a freelance capacity. This document sets out the proposed competency requirements for registrants working in independent practice. These competencies have been identified as the minimum requirements for all UKVRN registrants (ANutr and RNutr) to practice safely, ethically and effectively, while working in independent practice.
- All AfN registrants working in independent practice are currently expected to
 demonstrate that they have the skills and knowledge required to do so, while
 upholding the AfN Standards of Ethics, Conduct and Performance, and working
 within their individual scope of practice. Under the new proposals, to be identified
 as being safe and competent to practice in an independent/freelance capacity,
 registrants will be required to demonstrate their achievement of the AfN
 Independent Practice Competencies.



Independent Practice Competencies: Legal

As a UKVRN Registrant working in independent practice, you should be able to:

IP1: Demonstrate safe and professional practice through understanding and adhering to legal requirements and procedures, including, but not limited to:

- Creating appropriate business policies and procedures for the gathering and storage of data, privacy, and complaints, adhering to relevant regulations
- Designing business contracts, and being aware of legal documents such as nondisclosure agreements, understanding the implications of signing such documents and identifying when you should seek professional legal support
- Holding appropriate insurance, understanding business, liability and legal risks involved in providing advice or services





Proposed Competencies

Independent Practice Competencies: Communication and Consultation Skills

As a UKVRN Registrant working in independent practice, you should be able to:

IP2: Conduct client and business consultations and communications professionally and ethically, by:

- Using language and communication styles appropriate to business setting and platform
- Marketing your services appropriately, professionally, and ethically in line with AfN Standards of Ethics, Conduct and Performance
- Designing and planning appropriate consultations, including structure, required paperwork, resource provision and appropriate software, platforms and technology
- Managing client expectations from initial communications through to activity end
- Establishing appropriate professional networks to allow for collaboration and onward referrals, understanding which clients you can provide services to and who to refer to when work is outside own scope of practice or supervision is required
- Using appropriate behavioural change methods and interpersonal skills, e.g. active listening, recognising when adaptation is necessary to overcome barriers
- Supporting clients to set realistic goals, e.g. by using the SMART method, measuring progress effectively and adapting when necessary



Proposed Competencies

Independent Practice Competencies: Reflection, Evaluation and Support

As a UKVRN Registrant working in independent practice, you should be able to:

IP3: Demonstrate regular reflection, evaluation and development of professional practice and competence, by:

- Applying reflective practice to your business activities, auditing and amending own practice to improve output
- Establishing appropriate support systems, whether RNutr to ANutr mentorship, or RNutr to RNutr peer support, understanding the importance of support for development at all career stages and experience levels



Consultation Questions
